## Northern Saw-whet Owl Nest Box Project: 2021 Update

Starting in 2003, Northern Saw-whet Owls (Aegolius acadicus) have been nesting in owl nest boxes placed

in mixed Ponderosa Pine/deciduous draw habitat in Custer National Forest in Harding County (Miller, C. E., 2010, Nesting Nesting Saw-whet Owls in Harding County. SDBN 62(3):56-59; Miller, C. E., 2015, Saw-whet Owls and Forest Fires in the Slim Buttes. SDBN 67(3):62-64). Starting with seven boxes, there now are 146 boxes scattered throughout the five units of the National Forest (Slim Buttes, North and South Cave Hills, East and West Short Pines). Every year the boxes are checked in early spring for owl occupancy and monitored throughout the season to determine number of eggs and nestlings, and nest success. All of these metrics vary dramatically among years, with unusually high occupancy and nest success in 2007, 2011, 2015, and 2019, and unusually low occupancy and nest success in 2006, 2009, 2013, and 2017. This article provides an update on the current situation.

Following an above average season last year, 2021 ended up being well below average for nesting Sawwhet Owls. There were six attempts (nests in which eggs were laid). Clutch size was 3.3 eggs, well below the overall average of 5.6 with five or six being the typical nest. This year there were three nests with four eggs, two nests with three eggs, and one nest with two eggs. Two nests were lost to predation sometime during incubation. One nest initiated in early June had two of the three eggs hatch, but both young perished in the nest in late July shortly before fledging, possibly due to the hot weather at the time. Daytime temperatures were in the 100s with nighttime temperatures only cooling down to the mid 80s. The three remaining nests fledged seven young, well below the highest year of 2015 when 235 fledged.

The number of cached prey in the nest during incubation and brooding was also way down, especially in the later nests. An interesting and unusual note: one nest initiated in late April had three eggs, two mice and eight bats when the nest was checked in early May (see photo). The bats appeared to be Little Brown Myotis. I've only been able to document bats as prey on three other occasions: A pellet in the prey mat with a skull identified as a Silver-haired bat, a prey mat with the long wing bones of a bat, and an intact Little Brown Myotis in the prey mat of this year's nest with the two young that perished.

There were three other nests, all early, with numerous Saw-whet feathers and partial remains in the box. I have witnessed Saw-whets calling from the opening of a nest cavity early in the nesting season. This is speculation on my part, but I would guess in these cases male Saw-whets advertising for a mate fell prey to Eastern Screech-Owls. This has happened nine times in past years.

## Range Expansion of Breeding Osprey (Pandion haliaetus) in South Dakota

The Osprey (*Pandion haliaetus*) is a large, fish-eating raptor found throughout the world. The main portion of the Osprey's North American breeding range is along the coasts, and in Alaska, Canada, the Rocky Mountains, and the Great Lakes. Here in South Dakota, Osprey historically nested in the southeastern corner of South Dakota along the Missouri River during the 1880s (Agersborg 1885). However, the species was absent as a breeder from the state for more than 100 years. This article summarizes Osprey breeding biology and the history of the establishment and expansion of breeding Ospreys in South Dakota.

### BASIC BREEDING BIOLOGY

Osprey feed exclusively on fish and thus breed near water with adequate fish populations. They choose areas with an elevated nest site that is protected from ground predators and an adequate supply of fish within commuting distance (less than 15 miles). Breeding pairs easily habituate to human activities near their nest. In the Black Hills, Osprey begin nesting after ice-out in early April and nests may last into August. The nest is a bulky pile of sticks that the pair add to each year. Nests become huge after a few years and can host smaller cavity-nesting birds, such as Tree Swallows and House Sparrows, in the lower parts. Clutch size is 3 eggs; each egg is laid every 2 to 3 days. The male feeds the female during egglaying and the following 38-day incubation period. When small, the nestlings are fed pieces of fish by an adult. Older chicks eat the fish by themselves. Chicks are 51 to 54 days old at first flight but young Osprey are dependent on their parents for food for at least another 10 to 20 days. After migrating, first-year birds generally remain on the wintering grounds for 18 months, returning to breed when 3 years old (Bierregaard et al. 2020).

### ESTABLISHMENT AND EXPANSION OF BREEDING PAIRS

Black Hills. The reestablishment of breeding Osprey in the state started in the Black Hills, and the bulk of the breeding population occurs here. Osprey probably never nested in the Black Hills before European settlement because of a lack of suitable fish populations. However the introduction of trout into Black Hills streams and building of reservoirs stocked with fish have provided a reliable food source. A pair built a nest near Pactola Reservoir in the east-central Hills in 1990 and returned in 1991 to successfully raise chicks. During the second South Dakota Breeding Bird Atlas (2008-2012), at least 16 nests were active (Drilling et al. 2018) and there currently are more than 25 active nests in and around the Black Hills (SDGFP 2020).

Natural Osprey nest sites are trees or ledges on rocky cliffs. However Osprey are adaptable and will nest on man-made structures. Many Black Hills nests are built on power line structures. This is not desirable because birds may be electrocuted or could cause power outages or even fires. Thus, SDGFP and utility companies have worked together to move these nests to nearby nesting platforms, which the birds readily accept. In addition, nesting platforms have been put up near lakes and other water bodies. During the second Atlas, all but two nests were on utility poles or artificial platforms, with the remaining two built in Ponderosa Pine snags. This propensity to nest on man-made structures and platforms continues and the majority of Black Hills nests are on these structures and platforms.

Missouri River. In an effort to reintroduce breeding Osprey in South Dakota, SDGFP reintroduced 120 young Ospreys along the Missouri River in southeastern South Dakota from 2003 – 2006 and from 2008 – 2010 (Dowd Stukel et al. 2011). None of these birds returned to nest in the area and no nesting is known to have occurred along this stretch of the river. However, one bird introduced in South Dakota in 2008 attempted an unsuccessful nest in Burt County, NE (about 50 miles south of Sioux City) in 2013 (Silcock and Jorgensen 2020).

Osprey had unsuccessfully attempted to nest on various dam structures at Big Bend Dam for several years before a successful nest in 2017. The female of that pair was one of the Osprey released in southeastern South Dakota in 2010. These birds continue to nest on a power line structure at the dam. Osprey have also

finally started to nest at Oahe Dam. See the article by Ricky Olson in this issue of Bird Notes for details.

Elsewhere. Osprey have nested in two areas in northeastern South Dakota since at least 2013. These birds are assumed to be an extension of Minnesota's Osprey population. Osprey nested on a cell phone tower near Hartford Beach State Park, Roberts County, until the tower was deactivated in 2019. Every year one to two pairs nest on platforms at Big Stone Power Plant in northern Grant County.

### CONSERVATION STATUS IN SOUTH DAKOTA

The Osprey is a state Species of Greatest Conservation Need and is listed as Threatened in the state (SDGFP 2014). In 2018, SDGFP developed goals to delist (remove) Osprey from the state Threatened species list (SDGFP 2020). The objective is to have a stable and successful set of nests within the Black Hills and elsewhere in the state. Specifically, for delisting, there must be an average of at least 20 active Osprey nests in the Black Hills for at least 5 years in a 7-year time span and a second group of an average of at least 6 active nests outside the Black Hills for at least 5 years in a 7-year time span. Currently the population outside of the Black Hills does not meet the goal and so Osprey continues to be on South Dakota's state Threatened list.

## First Nesting by Osprey at Canyon Lake Park, Rapid City

An Osprey nesting platform was installed in mid-October, 2015 at the northwest corner of Canyon Lake Park in Rapid City by South Dakota Game, Fish and Parks (SDGFP) and Black Hills Energy Corp. (BHE). The platform is located in the corner of a parking lot for anglers and walkers and also at the beginning of a hiking trail into a nature area. Although Osprey visited the well-stocked lake daily during the breeding season to obtain fish, five years passed before Osprey showed any interest in the platform.

In mid-May of 2020, an Osprey was observed bringing vegetation to the platform, adding to the branches

which had been previously placed there by Shelly Deisch, SDGFP biologist, to encourage nesting. For a week, a pair continued placing and arranging sod, sticks and tree branches on the platform creating a nest. The two birds were heard calling to each other while in flight and also were seen standing in the nest. Following this behavior, neither bird was observed near the nest and no other courtship behavior was observed. Osprey did continue to visit the lake as they had in previous years to catch fish and carry prey to other locations.

Osprey returned to Canyon Lake in 2021 in early April. On April 17, an individual was observed standing in the platform followed within a few days by a pair that began bringing nesting materials. Copulations were observed for the first time on April 22 and continued to be observed until May 4. The male brought fish to the female who was standing or sitting in the nest and both continued adding material to the nest.

Throughout May and June, the birds were on the platform and in the nest. The female was mostly down in the nest incubating eggs until late June when observers began to suspect that the eggs had hatched. The adults were noted leaning down into the nest possibly feeding young. On July 2, a small head was seen. Another day passed when a second head appeared followed by a third in another day or two, making a total of three nestlings. Throughout July and into August the adults continued to bring sticks and sod to the nest, as well as tending to the young with food and providing shelter with spread wings during hot days and rain storms. By mid-July the young in the nest were heard vocalizing and were seen feeding themselves by picking pieces from fish provided by the adults. The nest was occupied by at least one adult practically all day and night until late July. When Turkey Vultures, which had a large roost nearby, flew near the nest the male Osprey defended the area around the nest and was observed flying after the vultures. Additionally, a Bald Eagle that visited the nest area was actively pursued in flight by the male and was repeatedly attacked until it flew out of the area.

In mid-August the nestlings became more active, flapping their wings to exercise, moving about the nest, and even perching on the beams that extend from the platform. In late August all three nestlings fledged the nest. They traveled around the lake on short flights but did not attempt to catch fish at that time. However, observers on August 31 noticed one young in the nest continuously calling and behaving as though injured. The next morning Hal Bielstein photographed the bird and noticed that the bird had a leg injury. A large swath of heavy dense nylon material and wires, possibly part of a sun shade, had become attached to the young bird's lower leg and foot. The nylon had worn through the flesh which caused a deep infection in the foot. Bielstein, Maggie Engler at the Black Hills Raptor Center, and Shelly Deisch at SDGFP swung into action. Black Hills Energy provided a "bucket truck" and John Halverson from the Raptor Center rescued the injured fledgling from the nest. Biologist Deisch immediately drove the injured bird to a rehabilitation veterinarian in Pierre. The bird was operated on the next morning, September 2, which included removing a talon. The Pierre vet told Deisch that Osprey do not make good rehab patients because they need live fish from the parents to survive. Thus, the injured bird needed to be returned to the lake as soon as possible. The bird remained in rehab in Pierre until September 7. Upon returning to the nesting platform, it became known as "3-Toes" to the photographers and birders who had been observing the nest and its occupants throughout the season. As so many people were involved in the injured bird's discovery and recovery, Shelly Deisch stated "it takes a village to manage Osprey and the rescue was a fine example of that."

During the first week of September, the two uninjured fledglings were continuously practicing flying and diving into the water, learning how to retrieve fish. After "3-Toes" returned, all three young Ospreys at times returned to the nest to feed on fish provided by the adults. In late evening the young often left the nest to roost nearby in large trees. By mid-September the two uninjured fledglings and the female parent were no longer present at the lake. September 19 marked the last time the male parent brought a fish to the nest for the remaining fledgling and also marked its last appearance at the lake. "3-Toes", which had been observed flying longer distances but always returning to the nest, departed from the lake on the morning of September 22.. The Osprey family had left its nesting site to migrate south for the winter months.

The Osprey nesting at Canyon Lake won the attention and caring of people throughout the city, who visited the park frequently throughout the spring and summer. These people, who spoke of the birds as "our Osprey," felt they were part of the village that cared about these birds and their welfare. Visitors

and regulars at the lake continue to ask questions about where the birds went, when will they return, and whether the young will also come back. No doubt the village will be anxiously waiting and watching to see if the Osprey nesting story at Canyon Lake continues next year.

## Ospreys Nest in the Pierre South Dakota Area

I had four Osprey nest platforms erected in the Pierre area in 2008. The locations of the platforms were Farm Island backwater (Hipple Lake), mouth of the Bad River, along the Oahe Dam Stilling Basin, and along the pond near the Oahe West Tailrace.

I initiated this project for a few reasons: the SD GF&P was trying to reintroduce Ospreys near Yankton, Ospreys were staying in our area longer in the spring, higher numbers were being seen here, and more Ospreys were nesting in the Black Hills.

The erection of the platforms involved many people. I asked Doug Backlund to request funding from Missouri Breaks Audubon, which agreed to pay for materials. I constructed the platforms. I asked and received three power poles from the city of Ft. Pierre. Morris Inc. agreed to donate the metal screens for the bottoms. The city of Ft. Pierre dug the holes for three platforms and erected the poles with their boom truck. Oahe Downstream Park Manager Pat Buscher orchestrated the permissions with the Corps of Engineers and SD GF&P on the locations. SD GF&P put the platform on top of an existing pole at Farm Island.

Over the years many Ospreys sat on the platforms in May, but there was always only one adult present and no nesting attempt occurred.

Twice in the last few years, a pair of Ospreys attempted building a nest on the crane on the water intakes of Oahe Dam, but the Corps of Engineers removed the nest. In 2020 the Ospreys built a nest on the Missouri River railroad bridge. They were not successful even with a valiant attempt. The eggs never hatched. My hypothesis is the vibration of the train at fast speed addled the eggs and they were not viable.

In 2021 the Ospreys attempted to nest on the intakes again and, as before the Corps removed the nest. But this time, the pair moved to the platform near the west tailrace. The pair constructed a nest. The Osprey successfully fledged three young. During the third week of August the young were flying.

# The 2021 Spring Season 1 March 2021 to 31 May 2021

There were 309 species, including 4 rarities (Western Sandpiper, Pacific Wren, Kentucky Warbler, Cerulean Warbler) and 9 first county records reported to the SDOU online database during the season. The ten-year (2011-2020) average is 320. Below, I have tried to highlight the more significant sightings (early/late dates as given in the online database or first county records, indicated in bold; species that are significantly out of range; or confirmed breeding for species that breed early). For early/late migration dates, I have listed the three earliest/latest dates (by county). However, if these did not include a sighting East River, West River, and along the Missouri River, I have included the earliest/latest reported date from the missing region also. Included at the end of this report is a list of species that were not reported this year but might be expected during the Spring season. A species is placed on the list if it was not reported

- this year but had been reported during spring in at least 2 of the previous 5 years. Numbers in parentheses indicate the number of consecutive years (up to 4) that the species has appeared on the list during the season.
